In March 2021, Committee for Brisbane members set a visionary statement for South East Queensland for



Last month we conducted a poll on LinkedIn to see what our members and followers identify as Brisbane's best asset.

The results were as follows;

Natural Beauty and Recreation

57% respondents prioritised Brisbane's natural beauty and abundant outdoor recreational opportunities. From green spaces to parks and iconic landscapes, Brisbane's natural assets serve as a cornerstone of its appeal.

Cultural Scene

A significant portion of respondents, highlighted Brisbane's vibrant cultural scene, encompassing festivals, museums, and galleries. The Committee is pleased to see creativity and culture as a key pillar of a city's liveability being represented so strongly in the results.

World-Class Sporting Events and Facilities

For 17% of participants, Brisbane's reputation as a hub for world-class sporting events and facilities stood out as a key drawcard.

Quality Education and Research Institutions: 6%

While a smaller percentage highlighted Brisbane's education and research institutions as a key drawcard to the region, we recognise its significance in the development of a better Brisbane. These institutions not only contribute to the city's intellectual capital but also attract students and researchers, further enhancing Brisbane's reputation as a knowledge hub.


